A short cycle program of education, lasting 3 semesters with a great number of English language classes, including training in the field of practical knowledge of a foreign language, passed on in pre-school and early school classes, and obligatory participation in internships. The specialist education cycle may be online, hybrid or stationary.

If participants of specialist education decide to start their first-cycle studies in English philology, it is possible to recognise some of the competences obtained earlier at level 5 and shorten the period of education at level 6.

5. The dauration, rules and forms of apprenticeship (number of hours, learning outcomes, methods of verification of the assumed learning outcomes).

Participants complete 180 hours of apprenticeship in educational institutions (130 hours) and other organisations (50 hours). The internship takes place in semester 2 and 3. During the internship, the participant learns the basic methods and techniques, including e-learning, as well as the use of modern technologies used in the process of teaching a foreign language.

During the internship, the participant acquires the ability to select appropriate working methods necessary for a foreign language trainer, and to use the available resources and materials, including those created by him, in order to design and implement didactic activities. The methods of assessing the achievement of learning outcomes by an individual participant are the observation made during the classes he conducts and the continuous assessment of all internships.

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 $7. \quad \textbf{Requirements for completion of Short Cycle Higher Education (final exam or other).}$

The short cycle studies end with a final exam in the form of a presentation of the lesson chosen by the participant during the apprenticeship. The participant may prepare multimedia materials or other teaching aids for the presentation. After the presentation, the student answers 3 questions regarding: 1) the diploma lesson; 2) didactics of the subject and 3) a random question concerning the entire curriculum.
